I have no words to explain how this made me feel. If you want to experience personally how much we are appreciated, I encourage you to sign up or join one of us to make a delivery!



Our mission is to serve the community by providing items of warmth, comfort and dignity, hand-crafted by our volunteers, and clothing donated by our neighbors.






KEEP IT CLEAN! (and fragrance-free!)

And now that the colder weather is almost upon us, please note that:


Winter coats of ALL sizes (both adult & children's) are needed!

Veterans Giveaway

Board members Linda and Jeannie participated in a Veterans Giveaway on November 8th at the VA Clinic on Southpointe Drive near the DMV. They were there all day and met over 80 veterans! Linda shares her story:

"We gave away over 60 lapghans, 15 hats, and 9 frilly scarves. Everyone was so very, very appreciative!

Some of their stories brought tears to our eyes. One in particular was a female veteran whose disabled daughter lives in a facility. The daughter has been unable to do most things since she was 1 and a half; she is wheelchair bound.



Pam Greswolde's Coconut Layer Cake

Always a favorite at our workshops!

Ingredients:

- 1 (15.2 oz) pkg of Butter Flavored cake mix 2 cups sugar
- 1 (16 oz.) carton sour cream
- 1 (12 oz.) pkg coconut (see note below)
- 1 1/2 cups frozen Cool Whip

Directions:

Prepare cake mix as directed, making two 8" round layers. Cool completely. Split each layer to make a total of 4 layers.

Combine sugar, sour cream and coconut, blending well. Chill for at least an hour. Gently fold in the whipped topping with the sour cream mixture. Spread a layer of mixture between layers of cake. Spread remaining mixture on the top and sides of cake. Seal cake in an airtight container and refrigerate for three days before serving. This REALLY makes a difference in the flavor of the cake!

NOTE: I like to add more coconut on the top and sides of cake, pressing into the mixture immediately after covering the cake with the sour cream mixture. This requires more than one pkg of coconut and is optional.



The mother was thrilled when Jeannie showed her the side wheelchair totes (she chose 2) and the wheelchair tote (she chose 1). We also gave her a fidget ball for her daughter.

Several of the veterans were blown away by the lapghans made for them by a fellow female veteran!

Tip of the Month:

Too many projects! Too many patterns! How do you keep track of them all, especially when you're on the go?!?

I like to make photocopies of my favorite patterns and keep them in plastic page protectors, which I then organize in a 3-ring binder by category. This allows me to make notes and highlights on the pattern as desired, and I can also easily keep the pattern with the project and avoid lugging a whole book about!

To keep track of where I am in the pattern, I use a strip of blue painter's tape. I found this stays put better than a sticky note but can still be easily and repeatedly moved as needed.
